RECIPE OF THE QUARTER

aaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaa

Famous BINGO Chocolate Mint Brownies

(Member of Minneola Basket Weaving Guild)

1 cup sugar 1/2 cup butter

4 eggs

1 cup flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 can Hershey syrup

1 teaspoon vanilla

Cream butter and sugar. Add rest of ingredients, mix well. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 30 minutes in 9x13 greased and floured pan.

Filling:

2 cups powdered sugar sifted

1/2 cup butter

2 tablespoons milk

1/2 teaspoon mint flavoring, NOT peppermint green food coloring

Glaze:

1 cup chocolate chips6 tablespoons butterMelt and drizzle or spread over filling

Cool brownies before spreading the mint filling over them.

Allow mint filling to set up before spreading the glaze over the top.

The coffee pots were plugged in, the coolers filled with ice, the hot dogs set to cook. Hand-made baskets arrived to grace the tables and lend an air of fall decor. Bars and desserts (more donations – thank you Minneola Guild and all who baked for us) were cut and arranged on platters. The Bingo Machine was set in place and we were ready for action!! At 11 am the doors opened and the flow of guests began. Groups of relatives, work colleagues and friends staked out their territories and enjoyed time to visit and examine the prizes that might be theirs, if their luck was good. At noon the welcome was given and the games began.

At the end of the day we were all exhausted, but happy. Clean-up went quickly as many stayed to help. We had another full-house and I believe everyone left anticipating next year's Basket Bingo.

Jill Scarpari and Jo Guttormson chaired the event this year and with the help of MANY, MANY additional guild members (and some non-members too!) this year's bingo was the most successful ever – financially. The money raised by bingo is used by to help pay rent at the Textile Center for our monthly meetings, send newsletters, sponsor special events, and help with other costs incurred during the year. This year's event, after expenses, earned the guild \$2168. Thank you to all who donated their time and experience, their baskets, their baked goods, door prizes and who attended (to work or to play) and brought guests. The Minnesota Basket Weavers Guild is a wonderful organization and this event is fun and profitable **and** it helps the guild function throughout the year.
