Upcoming Classes April 28, 2012



Teacher: Connie Ryks

Cost: \$55

Description: This is a beautiful coiled pine needle basket with an agate center. You will be able to finish this basket in the size shown (you may have enough material to make it larger, but you would not be able to finish a larger basket the same day). Dimensions approximately 5" x 4.5".

Skill Level: Advanced Beginner

Tools: Typical basketmaking tools

Teacher: Janet Olney

Cost: \$55

Description: This Shaker Cat's Head Basket has a solid green inner basket with a twill woven on the outer basket. If time permits students can add a band of French Randing. Dimensions approximately 9-10" x 13-14" x 8-9" high.

Skill Level: Advanced

Tools: Typical basketmaking tools





Teacher: Cynthia Stuck

Cost: \$29

Description: Made almost entirely of recycled materials, this basket is woven of hand-painted cardboard, decorated with colorful shipping tape or nylon cord. Weavers may choose from sets of cardboard strips painted in bright, adventurous colors. Approximately 9" diameter x 10" high. Pattern owner is English basketmaker Lois Walpole in "Creative Basket Making".

Skill Level: All Levels

Tools: Please bring 2 yards of heavy button thread and a large eyed needle to carry it as well as typical basketmaking tools. Please bring a hot glue gun if you have one.

Teacher: Susan Coyle

Cost: \$40

Description: This beautiful basket is woven on a black walnut base with natural reed in an intermediate or advanced design. The design is then accented, as much or as little as you want, with different combinations of space dyed colors, making an interesting look to the basket. Students will have fun picking out their different colors of space dyed. The basket is lashed with waxed linen thread. Some embellishment may need to be finished outside of class. A simpler twill will be offered as well as the one picture. This is Susan Coyle's own pattern. Dimensions 9"W x 5"L x 3.5" H



Skill Level: Intermediate/Advanced

Tools: Typical basketmaking tools.





Teacher: Bob Coyle

Cost: \$62

Description: Very large and sturdy basket due to heavy laced runners running along the bottom of the basket. Different colors available for the accent or make it natural. Double hand carved oak swing handles make the basket easy to carry in from the garden. This would also make a great picnic basket due to the double handles for stability. Dimensions 19" x 13" x 4"H

Skill Level: Intermediate

Tools: Typical basketmaking tools.

MBWG Cooks

Spiced Fruit - Layce Parkinson

1 can pears, 1 can peaches, 1 can of apricots, 1 can pineapple, all drained

1 banana

1/2 t grated lemon

1 T brown sugar Cinammon to taste

1 t curry 2 T butter

2 t cornstarch

Put in different spices or different fruits. (I used some gram marsala as well as the curry) Combine in casserole sprinkle with butter & cornstarch.

Bake 1 hour @325. Can be served cold or hot

Golden Winter Soup - Jill Scarpari

2 tbsp butter 2 c sliced leek (about 2 medium)
5 c. cubed peeled butternut squash 4 c fat-free, less sodium chicken broth

2 c cubed peeled russet potato (1 very large, or 2 large) 1 c. half and half (or milk)

1 tsp kosher salt chopped hazelnuts 1/2 tsp freshly ground black pepper chopped apples

Melt butter in a large Dutch over over medium-high heat. Add squash, potato, salt and pepper to pan; saute 3 minutes.

Add leek; saute 1 minute. Stir in broth; bring to a boil. Reduce heat, and simmer 20 minutes or until potato is tender, stirring occasionally. Use immersion blender to cream soup or put into a blender. If the soup is hot, remove center piece of blender lid (to allow steam to escape). add some soup. Replace lid on top and put towel over opening in blender lid-to avoid splatters. Blend until smooth, repeat until all of soup is blended. Add half and half or milk. Sprinkle with hazelnuts and/or apples and enjoy!

^{*}I use cooked squash I have frozen in place of the fresh squash, use same amount of cups.
