Missouri Conference By Alice Ford

Last Spring, Roxanne Miller and I decided to attend the Missouri Conference held August 1-4th. It was another opportunity to join another Basket Guild. Cost \$25.00. The information to join as well as the Conference agenda is on-line at <u>www.unionpoint.net/mbg</u>.

This year the Conference was held in the Kansas City Area at the Hilton Garden Inn in Independence, MO., a very fine hotel with lots of space for the event.

Over one hundred excited, talented and extremely skillful weavers gathered to weave through the four-day event. It was amazing to see so many talented and creative teachers. One of my teachers was Bonnie Gale, a well known willow teacher from England and the East Coast who makes beautiful willow baskets and sculptures. She shared her English version of willow weaving. She was informative, giving the history of willow growing and weaving techniques. While learning new techniques for weaving willow, I made a muffin basket.

On Friday, I took a class from Annetta Kraayveld. The basket was called "Montana". The class was intense. The results were terrific. Annetta has fabulous basket patterns with many new twists and turns on each basket. If you have the chance, take a class form Annetta.

The Conference had several vendors selling supplies. One evening, all the teachers and Guild members had a couple hours to sell their baskets, patterns and supplies. I found a lady, Barb McNally from Missouri who designed socks with a basket theme. Each year she creates a new design and has them woven by a local company. The socks are sold only at the Conference. Naturally, I purchased a pair. I wonder what she will come up with next year! Seems my suitcase needs to be bigger if I continue to attend these events.

Both Roxanne and I won drawings for cash for the Conference next year that will be held in St Louis, MO, July 31-August 3rd 2014. With such a wide variety of teachers to choose from, this is an excellent Conference to attend. Most everything is reasonably priced. St Louis is about a ten hour drive, shorter of course, if you fly. I'm planning to take classes from the teachers I discovered at this year's Conference. The Birch Bark Bowl, Reed on Gourd or the Alaskan Yellow Cedar Bracelet. Don't they sound interesting?

CALL FOR ARTISTS:

Crossings is organizing a Jewelry and Textile Exhibit for December 2013

Fabrications Ten Deadline: Saturday, November 9, 2013

Textile, fiber and jewelry artists are invited to submit work for the annual juried December exhibit "Fabrications" at Crossings. Consider this an opportunity to explore your medium, stretch it to new lengths, twist and turn it into new forms, spin in new technologies or ancient methods, string on a bit of fantasy and let viewers feel what you've felt. Entries can include artwork such as contemporary gallery pieces, wall hangings, 3-dimensional fiber sculpture, wearable art of all types, handcrafted jewelry, and holiday ornaments. Jurors will focus particularly on innovative designs and craftsmanship.

This exhibit is open to all fiber and jewelry artists interested in displaying and selling their work. Fiber arts may include batik, surface design, felting, quilting, rug hooking, spinning, weaving, knitting, fiber sculpture, handcrafted paper and note cards, and needlework. Jewelry arts may include fiber, beading, stone, metal, paper and multimedia.

Guidelines: All entries must be original. No imports, commercial or manufactured items, or items created from kits or copied from published patterns will be accepted.

Submit 3-5 original pieces **MAXIMUM**, with an entry form (below) and \$15 entry fee per person (not per piece) by Saturday, November 9, 2013 to: Crossings, 320 East Avenue, Zumbrota, MN 55992. All entries must be delivered in a box or container clearly labeled with the artist's name, contact information and itemization of contents. Crossings cannot be responsible for unlabeled, untagged or loose entries.

All submissions will be juried. Those invited to be part of the exhibition may be asked to bring additional pieces for the show, which will be displayed in the gallery December 1-31, 2013. Additional pieces must arrive at Crossings by Tuesday, November 26, 2013. Please do not bring additional pieces unless they are requested.

Each item must be individually tagged with your name, title, and selling price, including a 35% Crossings commission. All artwork must be display-ready with appropriate display materials (black background) or hanging devices. Crossings reserves the right to reject any entries not legibly tagged.

INTERNATIONAL ENTRIES: Due to shipping costs, different currencies and customs fees, Crossings are unable to accept entries from outside the United States.

INSURANCE: All artwork will be insured while at Crossings for the duration of the show. The artist is responsible for insuring the artwork in transit.

SALES: All work must be for sale. Crossings retains a 35% commission.

SHIPPING: Artists are responsible for all shipping fees. Crossings will return unsold work when self-addressed, postage-paid packaging materials are provided. Otherwise a \$20 handling fee will be charged in addition to postage.

ARTISTS RECEPTION: A public reception will be held on Saturday, December 7, 2-4 pm. Everyone is invited!
