2013 Financial Report

The MN Basket Weavers Guild continues to be healthy financially, largely due to our membership numbers holding and to our efforts to make a successful fundraiser of Basket Bingo.

We maintain a balance on hand of roughly \$9,000 that starts our year. Our annual rental at the Textile Center runs about \$2000, and we make about that much at Bingo--which is always our goal. This past year we had an increase in the numbers of renewing members--with about 50 renewing members compared to 35 in 2012. This was due in party to an active "reminder" system using e-mail, which hadn't been used the previous year. We'll definitely do that again with the 2014 reminders!

Our final figures for Basket Bingo aren't yet ready--all invoices and reimbursement requests have not yet come in. However, we do anticipate the income to be down a bit from the previous year--we think probably due to parking problems near the U made more difficult on days with football games. These increase the costs of parking in nearby lots. We should still clear about \$2000.

We continue to award honorary memberships to State Fair Winners in relevant basket categories, and support sister guilds by offering a couple of memberships as door prizes for special events in Bemidji and Winona. Our major expenses (after rent) are for memorial gifts when a member's close family member passes and supporting the summer event. In this case, there is building rent which the Guild covers rather than pro-rating it among those registering for classes.

We have re-energized "A Random Act of Kindness" started some years ago by Diane Erickson. This fund is often used to help support a member's registration at a special event here or elsewhere. Fundraisers are conducted throughout the year, generally the sale of handmade or donated items at meetings, to provide the funds. These are co-mingled in the bank account with our general funds, but tracked separately on the financial report. We currently have about \$250 in that fund.

She made crocheted potholders in our favorite colors for all of us, mine stays in my tool bucket. Char will be missed –. Rest and be at peace our weaving friend! There is no more pain and no more suffering."

Charlene Jones, 58, of Wilton, MN died Sunday, December 15, 2013 in Neilson Place, Bemidji, MN A memorial ervice was heldl at 2:00 p.m., Friday, December 27, 2013 at the First Baptist Church, Bemidji with Rev. Stan Nelson officiating.

Charlene Denise Johnson was born July 15, 1955 in St. Paul, MN to Charles and Josephine (Madison) Johnson. She grew up in St. Paul and attended school in Duluth, MN. In August 1971 she married Ronald Jones in Sisseton, SD. They lived in Omaha, NE and Bemidji, MN. She worked as an inspector and laborer for Nortech Systems in Bemidji for 21 years, retiring in August due to her illness. She enjoyed the Paul Bunyan Vintage Auto Club where she served as an officer. She was founder of the car club friends weekend held in March each year. She belonged to the Headwaters Basket Weavers Guild. Charlene was involved in the Relay for Life as a 35 year cancer survivor and worked with other ladies putting together care packets for cancer patients. For 30 years she sold her crafts at the Old Schoolhouse. She loved to crochet and knit. Charlene loved spending time with her grandchildren.
