### **NBO Guild Advisory Committee**

At the NBO 2015 Conference in Minneapolis, the Guild Advisory Committee hosted a lunch meeting for guilds to talk among themselves about what they would like from the NBO. One clear request was a way for guilds to talk to each other. In response, we have launched the Basket Guild Bulletin Board, a Facebook group intended for allow communication between guilds, and for guilds to tell basketmakers across North America what they are doing:

The Basket Guild Bulletin Board is a Facebook group sponsored by the National Basketry Organization to help facilitate information sharing between basketry guilds, related non-profit groups and individual guild members across North America.

Any guild member, NBO member or basket weaver is welcome to join. Posts and discussion are intended to promote basketry. Our biggest goal is to provide a platform for basketry guilds to communicate with each other.

We encourage guilds, non-profit craft schools and individual instructors who teach in these formats to tell others about their events. Teachers and guilds can use this information to help facilitate sharing teachers between several venues. Guilds can use the group to talk amongst themselves about issues they encounter, how to attract new members, what activities are most successful. We hope that through this new group the activities of the many basketry guilds across North America will be more visible and will encourage even more basketmakers to participate.

### TREASURER'S REPORT


